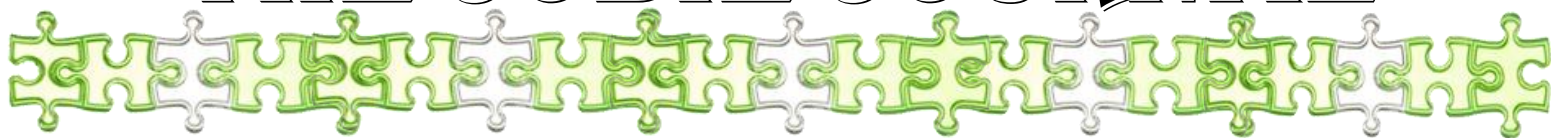

"Daughter Safety and Awareness Program"

Dear Bethels, the "Daughter Safety and Awareness Program" needs to be presented to ALL daughters by December 31, 2016.

This program is designed to help explain what the Youth Protection Program (YPP) is to the Daughters. This presentation can be done at any Bethel function or meeting and does not have to be presented by a Certified Adult Volunteer Trainer (CAVT).

The important thing is that the Daughters receive the information. Please make sure that the Daughters receive the handouts, review, and the certificate of completion is filled out. (they are available for download with the presentation.)

Once the program has been presented to the Daughters, the Council must submit the Reporting Form to your Grand Secretary.

Hello Everyone!!

It's your Miss South Dakota Alicia here, and although I talked about it briefly at Jobie U, I thought it might be a good idea to let everyone know about my service project. This year I am hoping to assemble multiple "Kids Care Kits" for the Shriner Hospitals of America so that I can make the travel process and relocation for the children a little easier. I am hoping each Bethel can put together at least three kits: one for teens, one for girls, and one for boys (although more than three would be greatly appreciated, as the Bethel who donates the most kits will be receiving a wonderful prize).

Some ideas for what may be in the kits include:

- Fleece Blankets (of all sizes)
- Stuffed Animals (or other figures, such as Barbie Dolls/ Hot Wheels)
- Unopened Toys – non-latex please (Nerf Balls, Dominoes, Lego Kits, etc.)
- Playing Cards and/or Card Games
- Activity and Craft Kits
- Coloring Books, with crayons or markers
- Play Dough
- Bubbles
- Chapstick
- G, PG, or PG-13 Movies (2014-2016)
- Journals or Diaries
- And sugar free mints (such as life savers)

This is only a general idea for what may be included though, and if you think of something that would be a good fit, please feel free to add it. If possible, I would prefer that these kits be placed in a backpack the children could take with them as they travel. Just so you know these kits do not need to cost more than \$20 a piece if you look for the sales (although I would hit up Dollar Tree for most of it). Thank you so much ahead of time for donating to something so close to our hearts, I can't wait to see what we can do, not only in our Bethels, but in our state as well.
